The meeting of the Metropolitan Sewerage District Board was held in the Board Room 501, City Building, Asheville, North Carolina, at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 17, 1963.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Peterson. The roll was called by Mrs. Swicegood, Secretary, with the following members present: Mr. Peterson, Mr. Garrison, Sr., Mrs. Swicegood, Mr. Spicer, Mr. Adams, Mr. Dawson, Mr. Finch, Mr. Reagan, Mr. Robinson, and Mr. Tandy.

It was moved by Mr. Finch that the Board dispense with reading the minutes and that they be approved as prepared and mailed to the members. This motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Johnson stated that a copy of his progress report had been given to each member.

He also informed the Board of receipt of a congratulatory telegram from Mr. Hubbard regarding the successful outcome of the bond referendum held December 14, 1963.

In response to a question raised at the previous meeting by Mr. Adams, Mr. Johnson said that based upon water revenue from 26,20% customers having sewer service and 3,800 with no sewer connection, the estimated annual revenue would amount to \$777,012 using the rate schedule adopted at the November meeting of a minimum of \$1.00, a maximum for single-family dwellings of \$4.00, and a 40% charge for the remaining customers. He stated that with normal growth he felt this amount would be sufficient to cover principal, interest, and operational costs.

The Board endorsed unanimously a motion made by Mr. Adams that Mr. Johnson send appropriate letters of appreciation to those individuals who were helpful in the successful passage of the bond referendum.

Mr. Johnson presented the following with a request that the Board authorize immediate action:

- 1. That Mr. Hendon bring his preliminary report to date.
- 2. That Mr. Hendon be requested to furnish the staff with a proposed time schedule of engineering procedure.
- 3. That the staff prepare proper application for Federal grant.
- 4. That the Board receive the official results of the bond referendum.
- 5. That the staff send copies of necessary documents to the proper officials.

Upon motion of Mr. Garrison, seconded by Mr. Spicer, it was unanimously voted to proceed on the suggested items.

Mr. Redmond, Attorney to the Board, presented a certified copy of the election results from the Buncombe County Commissioners as follows:

Section 1. The returns of the special bond election held on December 14, 1963, in the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County, having been received from the proper election officers and the Board having canvassed the same, the following facts are hereby found and determined:

(a) That at a special bond election held in the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County on December 14, 1963, there was submitted to the qualified voters of said District the following question:

Shall a bond order adopted by the District
Board of the Metropolitan Sewerage District
of Buncombe County, North Carolina, on the
8th day of October, 1963, authorizing the
issuance of not exceeding \$10,400,000 Sewage
Disposal System Bonds of said Metropolitan
Sewerage District for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds,
for constructing a sewage disposal system
for said District, including treatment plants,
pumping stations, intercepting sewers, trunk
sewers, pressure lines, mains and all necessary appurtenances and equipment, and all
property, rights, easements and franchises
relating thereto, and the levy of a tax for
the payment thereof, be approved?

At said election a majority of the qualified voters of the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County who voted at said election voted for the approval of the bond order adopted by the Sanitary District Board of the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County on October 8, 1963, authorizing the issuance of not exceeding \$10,400,000 Sewage Disposal System Bonds of said Metropolitan Sewerage District for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing a sewage disposal system for said District, including treatment plants, pumping stations, intercepting sewers, trunk sewers, pressure lines, mains and all necessary appurtenances and equipment, and all property, rights, easements and franchises relating thereto, and the levy of a tax for the payment thereof.

At the special bond election held on December 14, 1963, in the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County, North Carolina, 8,368 voters were registered and qualified to vote.

At said election 4,484 voters voted for the approval of the bond order adopted by the District Board of said Metropolitan Sewerage District on October 8, 1963, authorizing the issuance of not exceeding \$10,400,000 Sewage Disposal System Bonds of said Metropolitan Sewerage District for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for constructing a sewage disposal system for said District, including treatment plants, pumping stations, intercepting sewers, trunk sewers, pressure lines, mains and all necessary appurtenances and equipment, and all property, rights, easements and franchises relating thereto, and the levy of a tax for the payment thereof, and 1.138 voters voted against the approval of said bond order authorizing the issuance of said bonds and the levy of a tax for the payment thereof, and therefore a majority of the qualified registered voters voting at the election voted for said bond order authorizing said \$10,400,000 Sewage Disposal System Bonds of the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County and the levy of a tax for the payment thereof.
