The regular monthly meeting of the Metropolitan Sewerage District Board was held in the Jaycees' office on the sixth floor, City Hall Building, Asheville, North Carolina, at 2 p.m., on Tuesday, March 16, 1976.

Vice-Chairman Williams called the meeting to order, and Mrs. Crowe called the roll. In addition to Vice-Chairman Williams, the following members were present: Messrs. Clark, Dawson, Dent, Dillingham, McDevitt, and Smith.

The members having received copies of the Minutes of the February 17 meeting, Mr. Clark moved the motion and Mr. Dawson seconded that the Minutes stand approved as read. Voice vote was unanimous.

Mr. W. H. Mull, Engineer-Manager, reported on the following:

Status of District's Bonds and possible advertisement for tenders. After discussion, the following Resolution was offered by the Board:

RESOLUTION OF THE METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICT BOARD OF BUNCOMBE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Trustee has informed the Metropolitan Sewerage District Board of current assets in the Reserve Account of \$1,684,000.00, which is substantially greater than the required reserve; and

WHEREAS, the Consulting Engineer and the Engineer-Manager recommend that a portion of the funds in said account be used for the redemption of the Bonds of the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Trustee be authorized and instructed to advertise for tenders and, if tenders are received and acceptable, to use \$500,000.00 of funds in said Reserve Account to redeem Bonds of the District at his discretion on or before May 14, 1976.

(c) Projected plans for South Buncombe Interceptor Sewer. After considerable discussion of both the cost and estimate of the proposed interceptor and being advised that both the Buncombe and Henderson Counties' Boards of Commissioners have passed resolutions requesting that MSD undertake said project, the following Resolution was presented to the Board:

RESOLUTION OF THE METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICT OF BUNCOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, WITH RESPECT TO THE EXTENSION OF THE SOUTH BUNCOMBE INTERCEPTING SEWER

WHEREAS, consultants engaged by the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County, North Carolina, to prepare a Section 201 facility plan pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 92-500 for the "Metro-Buncombe County Tentative 201 Planning Area" as defined by the North Carolina Department of Natural and Economic Resources have presented a plan to the Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County and to the Board of Commissioners of Henderson County whereby main sewer interceptor lines might be constructed in the South Buncombe-Avery's Creek, Buncombe County, and the Fletcher-Hoopers Creek, Henderson County, areas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County and the Board of Commissioners of Henderson County have adopted resolutions to implement said plan whereby authorization is given for the making of application for Federal and State funds for the design and construction of said interceptor lines; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County, North Carolina, has been designated in the respective resolutions of Buncombe and Henderson Counties as the official agent, representative, and/or official for each of said counties in applying for such funds; and

WHEREAS, an estimate of the costs of the design and the construction of said interceptor lines has been prepared by the consultants of the Metropolitan Sewerage District and has been accepted as a preliminary plan estimate for the purposes of this Resolution and those adopted by Buncombe and Henderson Counties, which said preliminary planning estimates show the contributions required to be made by each of said counties and by the Metropolitan Sewerage District with respect to the proposed South Buncombe Interceptor Lines; and

WHEREAS, said counties have resolved that upon completion of the project hereinbefore referred to the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County will become the owner of and operate and maintain interceptors designated on lines A, B, C, D, E, F, G, and H of the preliminary planning estimate, a copy of which is hereto attached and made a part of this Resolution and further providing that the said Metropolitan Sewerage District will succeed to and become the owner of all rights, easements and appurtenances with respect to said interceptors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the District Board of the Metropolitan Sewerage District of Buncombe County, North Carolina:

(e) Infiltration/Inflow Survey. The total estimated costs for the I/I survey is estimated at \$2,700,000.00, and the local share is \$337,500.00. A sample resolution had been drawn up by Mr. Redmond and was passed by the Buncombe County Board of Commissioners this date.
