BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICT OCTOBER 21, 2015

1. Call to Order and Roll Call:

The regular monthly meeting of the Metropolitan Sewerage District Board was held in the Boardroom of MSD's Administration Building at 2:00 pm, Wednesday, October 21, 2015. Chairman VeHaun presided with the following members present: Belcher, Bryson, Frost, Kelly, Manheimer, Pelly, Root, Watts and Wisler. Mr. Ashley and Mr. Creighton were absent.

Others present were Thomas E. Hartye, General Manager, William Clarke, General Counsel, Forrest Westall with McGill Associates, PA, Marcus Jones, Henderson County, Dustin Wilharm, City Resident, Ed Bradford, Scott Powell, Peter Weed, Jim Hemphill, Ken Stines, Mike Stamey, Matthew Walter, Hunter Carson, and Sondra Honeycutt.

2. Inquiry as to Conflict of Interest:

Mr. VeHaun asked if there were any conflicts of interest with the agenda items. No conflicts were reported.

3. Approval of Minutes of the September 16, 2015 Board Meeting:

Mr. VeHaun asked if there any changes to the Minutes of the September 16, 2015 Board Meeting. Ms. Frost moved for approval of the minutes as presented. Mr. Watts seconded the motion. Voice vote in favor of the motion was unanimous.

4. Discussion and Adjustment of Agenda:

None

5. Informal Discussion and Public Comment:

Mr. VeHaun welcomed Mr. Wilharm. Mr. VeHaun called for public comment.

Mr. Wilharm stated he is a resident of the Oakley neighborhood in Asheville. He reported about a year ago a \$1.2 million dollar sewer line repair project (Broadview) was awarded to Buckeye Bridge LLC, which is about one-half mile from his home. A vacant residential lot next door to his home was used to dump thousands of pounds of gravel and pipe. Although the project is complete, there is a lot of material and trash left on the site. He spoke with Mike Schraven, Senior Inspector with MSD, and said he was very polite and accommodating, but nothing has been done to date, therefore, Mr. Wilharm is asking the Board for help in resolving this issue. Mr. Hartye stated Mike Schraven made him aware of the situation, and the project involved heavy equipment and materials that needed to be close by.

He stated that Mike Schraven worked with the contractor to move most of the operation to separate areas. He further stated that Buckeye Bridge has a permit with the City of Asheville to stage its material. He presented slides showing what is left on the site. Mr. Hartye reported that MSD has informed Buckeye Bridge that it must remove the material by this Friday. In addition, the City was contacted to do a final inspection on Monday and to revoke Buckeye's permit.

6. Report of General Manager:

Mr. Hartye called on Mr. Clarke for a report on the water system litigation. Mr. Clarke reported that the North Carolina Court of Appeals reversed the trial court ruling that previously decided House Bill 488 was unconstitutional. The City of Asheville has indicated it will appeal the decision of the Court of Appeals to the North Carolina Supreme Court. He further reported that the City of Asheville's lawyers have asked that MSD not oppose the City's request to stay the transfer of the water system to MSD pending appeal. Mr. Clarke recommends MSD agree to this request. Mr. Root asked if the issue in the water lawsuit about the City's revenue bonds for the water system would still have to be litigated after the Supreme Court decision. Mr. Clarke stated that the Court of Appeals opinion was issued on October 6, 2015. The mandate from the Court of Appeals to the trial court will be issued on October 26, 2015. The City then has fifteen days to petition for rehearing or pursue an appeal to the Supreme Court. In its opinion, the Court of Appeals said that, because the issue about the bonds was not addressed by the trial court and not preserved on appeal, the issue has been abandoned. Mr. Clarke expects the City will appeal that ruling by the Court of Appeals as well. With no further discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that MSD not oppose the City's request for a stay of the transfer of the water system assets pending resolution of any appeal.

Mr. Hartye expressed appreciation to Owen Herbert for heading up the United Way Golf Tournament, and to Kaleena Anderson and Sheila Kilby for gaining sponsorships. The tourney was a great success and raised over \$7,000 (net of expenses) for United Way for the outing in which 61 people participated at the Grove Park.

Mr. Hartye reported a call was received from Terry Rice of Louisa Street to commend all of the workers that took care of his problem and said they did a fantastic job, were wonderful, and exceptional. Thanks to McKinley Hensley, Billy Cantrell, Mitch Metcalf, Grayson Hensley, Scott Graham, Pete Cole and James Beaver.

Mr. Hartye reported it has been a busy week at the Treatment Plant with removal of the Heat Exchanger. As a result, the solids processing end of the plant is shut down requiring sludge to be hauled to the Buncombe County Landfill. MSD has an agreement to take landfill leachate in return for the landfill taking MSD's sludge. Mr. Hartye presented slides showing

removal of the Heat Exchanger; burnt solids from the existing Exchanger, and the new Heat Exchanger. He stated MSD has a good contractor, and the project is going well.

Mr. Hartye reported the next ROW Committee meeting is scheduled for October 28th at 9 am. The next regular Board Meeting will be held November 18th at 2 pm.

7. Consolidated Motion Agenda:

a. Consideration of Bids for Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Project – South French Broad Interceptor Grouting:

Mr. Hartye reported this project is located along the French Broad River within the Biltmore Estate. Although the 36-inch concrete interceptor is in good structural condition, the joints have deteriorated over time. This has caused sinkholes in some areas, and allows for excessive infiltration when water levels are high. The work includes pressure testing each joint, and rehabilitating those which do not pass the pressure test. For each joint requiring rehabilitation, grout is pressureinjected and allowed to cure, thus sealing the joint from within the pipe. He presented an illustration showing how the grout is injected. He further reported the project is divided into two phases, over two budget years. The first phase is 12,000 LF, and the second phase is 10,000 LF. The contract was advertised and two bids were received on October 1, 2015. Since the required number of bids were not received, the contract was re-advertised and the following two bids were received on October 8. 2015: Bio-Nomic Services, Inc. with a total bid of \$547,998.00, and Lake County Sewer Co., Inc. with a total bid of \$503,599.00. Although the low bidder, Lake County Sewer, has not completed any previous projects for MSD, all references had positive comments regarding this company. The FY 15-16 construction budget for this project is \$567,000.00. Staff recommends award of this contract to Lake County Sewer Company, Inc. in the amount of \$503,599.00 subject to review and approval by District Counsel.

Mr. Watts asked if it is possible to bid the second phase while the contractor is still on site. Mr. Hartye stated it's a timing issue with the Estate in that the contractor needs to be in and out during their off season, which is the winter. Therefore, Phase 2 will be contracted between January and April the following year.

b. Consideration of Developer Constructed Sewer Systems: Biltmore Terrace Phase 2 Sewer Extension; Bridle Path Sewer Extension; Chapel Park Sewer Extension; Echo Hill Sewer Extension, and Mallard Run Sewer Extension:

Mr. Hartye reported the Biltmore Terrace Phase 2 sewer extension project is located inside the District boundary off Lamar Avenue in

Buncombe County. The project included extending approximately 656 linear feet of 8-inch public gravity sewer to serve the seventeen (17) unit residential development.

Mr. Hartye reported the Bridle Path sewer extension project is located inside the District boundary off Lookout Road in the City of Asheville. The project included extending approximately 129 linear feet of 8-inch public gravity sewer to serve the six (6) unit residential development.

Mr. Hartye reported the Chapel Park sewer extension project is located inside the District boundary. The project included extending approximately 247 linear feet of 8-inch public gravity sewer to serve the eight (8) unit residential development.

Mr. Hartye reported the Echo Hills Cottages sewer extension project is located inside the District boundary off Debra Lane in the City of Asheville. The project included extending approximately 530 linear feet of 8-inch public gravity sewer to serve the eleven (11) unit residential development.

Mr. Hartye reported the Mallard Run sewer extension project is located inside the District boundary off Glenn Bridge Road in Buncombe County. The project included extending approximately 1,806 linear feet of 8-inch public gravity sewer to serve the seventy-two (72) unit residential development.

Staff recommends acceptance of the aforementioned developer constructed sewer extensions. All MSD requirements have been met.

c. Consideration of Cash Commitment/Investment Report – Month Ended August 31, 2015:

Mr. Powell reported Page 25 presents the makeup of the District's Investment Portfolio. There has not been a significant change in the makeup of the portfolio from the prior month. Page 26 is the MSD Investment Manager report as of the month of August. The weighted average maturity of the investment portfolio is 298 days. The yield to maturity is 0.53% and is exceeding MSD bench marks of the 6-month T-Bill and NCCMT cash portfolio. Page 27 is an analysis of the District's Cash Receipts. Monthly and YTD domestic and industrial sewer revenue is considered reasonable based on timing of cash receipts and historical trends. Facility and Tap Fees are considered reasonable taking into account the unpredictability of cash receipts. Page 28 is an analysis of the District's Expenditures. Monthly and YTD expenditures are considered reasonable based on historical trends for operation maintenance, debt service, and capital projects. Page 29 is the MSD Variable Debt Service report. Both the 2008A Series are performing better than budgeted expectations. As of the end of September, both

issues have saved District customers approximately \$4.1 million dollars in debt service since April 2008.

BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN SEWERAGE DISTRICT SEPTEMBER 16, 2015

1. Call to Order and Roll Call:

The regular monthly meeting of the Metropolitan Sewerage District Board was held in the Boardroom of MSD's Administration Building at 2:00 pm, Wednesday, September 16, 2015. Chairman VeHaun presided with the following members present: Ashley, Belcher, Bryson, Creighton, Kelly, Manheimer, Watts, and Wisler. Ms. Frost, Mr. Pelly and Mr. Root were absent.

Others present were: Thomas E. Hartye, General Manager, William Clarke, General Counsel, Joseph Martin with Woodfin Sanitary Water & Sewer District, Jade Dundas with Asheville Water Resources and MSD Staff, Ed Bradford, Scott Powell, Jim Hemphill, Ken Stines, Mike Stamey, Matthew Walter, Hunter Carson, and Sondra Honeycutt.

2. Inquiry as to Conflict of Interest:

Mr. VeHaun asked if there were any conflicts of interest with the agenda items. No conflicts were reported.

3. Approval of Minutes of the August 19, 2015 Board Meeting:

Mr. VeHaun asked if there were any changes to the Minutes of the August 19, 2015 Board Meeting. Mr. Creighton moved for approval of the minutes as presented. Mr. Watts seconded the motion. Voice vote in favor of the motion was unanimous.

4. Discussion and Adjustment of Agenda:

None.

5. Informal Discussion and Public Comment:

Mr. VeHaun welcomed Mr. Martin and Mr. Dundas. There was no public comment.

6. Report of General Manager:

Mr. Hartye called on Ed Bradford and Mike Stamey for a presentation on current construction projects for the Treatment Plant and Collection System.

Mr. Bradford reported there are two major projects underway at the Plant. The first is the Influent Pump Station rehabilitation. The first pump was replaced in 2014; the second pump in May 2015, and the third pump to be replaced in FY2017. He stated they will take the best parts of the three (3) existing pumps to use as a backup pump. These pumps have been in service for approximately 25 years and have seen a lot of wear. In addition to the Influent Pumps, The Adjustable Frequency Drives (AFD's) will be replaced as a result of equipment problems due to age and a corrosive environment. The AFD's allow the pumps to ramp their speed up and down to match the flow coming into the plant. He presented slides showing the new AFD enclosure, which will be placed on a slab, and the interior space air conditioned to protect the equipment. Completion of this project is expected in January 2016.

Mr. Bradford reported the second project is the Incinerator Emissions Upgrade. Total construction cost is \$5.6 million, which was reduced by approximately \$5 million by utilizing new technology. This was pilot tested a year ago with very successful results and MSD got permission to use this from the Air Quality Agency. Due to the accelerated schedule imposed upon MSD by the EPA, combined with equipment manufacturing schedules, MSD managed an accelerated design timeframe with Consultant (CDM Smith); Preapproved Venturi manufacturer November, 2014; Pre-purchased Heat

Exchanger December, 2014, and awarded the Construction Contract in February, 2015. MSD is currently ahead of schedule and expects to have the project operational by January, 2016. Mr. Hartye noted that as a part of this project the incinerator must be shut down for approximately a month to replace equipment. Mr. Bradford presented a slide showing the Heat Exchanger, which recovers heat, and the Venturi Scrubber, which removes particulates. He presented three dimensional renderings of the equipment that is currently in the building, which is shown in color. He presented slides showing the instrument used to measure/locate the existing system and the Mercury-removal system and Venturi Scrubber being lifted into the building, which was a very tight fit. Mr. Bradford mentioned the Headworks project currently in the design phase, which was a primary recommendation of the recent Facilities Plan that includes fine screens, grit removal, and storage for peak flows. Mr. Bradford noted the CIP Status report (entire program) is posted on-line and updated quarterly. He called on Mr. Stamey for a report on recent construction activities.

Mr. Stamey began his presentation with a report on Construction Inspections, which is done with all construction contractors MSD hires. Currently, the most active project is the Melody Circle sewer rehabilitation project located in Swannanoa, North of U.S. Highway 70, and East of New Salem Road. The project consists of approximately 4,500 LF of sewer line in the Melody Circle neighborhood. Terry Brothers Construction is the contractor on this project. He presented a map showing the location of the line. To date approximately 1,500 LF of sewer line has been installed. He presented a slide showing the natural terrain of the neighborhood, which drops off into a valley, where the original sewer line was located. As a result, a sub-contractor was hired to trim some of the trees, which was negotiated during the Right of Way phase. He presented slides showing the installation of 8-inch ductile iron pipe; back filling of trench, and installation of asphalt binder. He presented slides showing the lower end of the project closest to New Salem Road; pre-construction looking east; during construction looking east, and post construction looking west.

Mr. Stamey reported the Broadview Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation project is located in Oakley and consists of 4,500 LF of sewer line, which is now complete. Buckeye Bridge was the contractor on this project. He presented several slides showing the project prior to construction; rocky working conditions during construction, and post construction (9/14/15). Mr. Stamey stated the CIP Inspectors Group is responsible for inspecting sewer rehab projects with contractors. They are also required to inspect sewer extensions put in by private developers across the county that may eventually come to MSD for ownership and maintenance. He presented a map showing the 43 active projects.

Mr. Stamey reported that currently, the biggest job for In-house Construction Crews is Gracelyn Road @ Warwick Place Sewer Rehabilitation in North Asheville. The existing sewer in this area is 4" Orangeburg pipe to be replaced by an 8" public sewer system that will be easier to maintain and service. He presented slides showing the bottom end of Warwick Place at Gracelyn Road where the pipe bursting project will take place. Another project just completed last week is Covington Street located in West Asheville. This project consisted of 180 ft. of pipe bursting and repair. He presented slides showing the equipment used to complete this project. He presented a copy of the In-House Construction projects (31) for FY15-16 of which 9 projects are complete.

Mr. Hartye presented a flyer for the fund raising tournament to be held at the Grove Park Inn Golf Course on Thursday, September 24th.

Mr. Hartye reported a call was received from Hugh Murphy of Locust Court in Arden regarding the MSD crew replacing the sewer line. He said that he couldn't praise them enough. From start to finish they were always doing something. They are a great team and work hard all day long. Thanks to Gilbert Karn, Dale Dillingham, Jason Price,

Tim Haney, Mickey Roberts, and Nicolas Hercules. Also, a call was received from Emily Lacey on Cedar Street expressing her appreciation for Mitch Metcalf and Scott Graham responding to a problem at her residence. She said they were wonderful and did a great job, and went above and beyond to help her out.

Mr. Hartye reported the September ROW Committee Meeting is cancelled. The next meeting is scheduled for October 28^{th} at 9am. The annual employee picnic will be held behind the Plant Maintenance Facility on September 22^{nd} starting at 8am. The next regular Board Meeting will be held October 21^{st} at 2pm.

7. Consolidated Motion Agenda:

a. Consideration of FY2016 Auditing Services RFP:

Mr. Powell reported an RFP for Auditing Services was sent to six auditing firms. On August 14th staff received responses from Cherry Bekaret LLP, McGladrey LLP, and Gould Killian CPA Group. All firms exhibited knowledge of the utility industry in North Carolina. The Selection Committee chose Cherry Bekaret due to their audit approach, firms staffing and turnover rate, and notably their governmental utility experience in North Carolina. The proposed fees for the FY2016 engagement were \$45,000, which is below the budgeted amount of \$46,500. The Selection Committee recommends Cherry Bekaret LLP as auditors for the FY2016 fiscal period.

b. Cash Commitment/Investment Report – Month Ended, July 31, 2015:

Mr. Powell reported Page 69 presents the makeup of the District's Investment Portfolio. There has been a \$7.6 million dollar decrease from the previous month report. This is a direct result of the District meeting its 7/1 debt service obligation. Page 70 is the MSD Investment Manager report as of the month of August. The weighted average maturity of the investment portfolio is 352 days. The yield to maturity is .52% and is exceeding MSD bench marks of the 6-month T-Bill and NCCMT cash portfolio. Page 71 is an analysis of the District Cash Receipts. Monthly domestic sewer revenue is considered reasonable based on historical trends. Monthly and YTD Industrial Sewer Revenue as well as Facility and Tap Fees are considered reasonable based on historical trends. Page 72 is an analysis of the District's Expenditures. Monthly and YTD expenditures are considered reasonable based on historical trends. Page 73 is the MSD Variable Debt Service report. Both the 2008 A Series are performing better than budgeted expectations. As of the end of August, both issues have saved District ratepayers approximately \$4.1 million dollars in debt service since April, 2008.

SUBJECT: South French Broad Interceptor Grouting Project: Consideration of Bids,

MSD Project No. 2011033

BACKGROUND: This project is located along the French Broad River within the Biltmore

Estate. The 36-inch concrete interceptor is in good structural condition; however, the joints have deteriorated over time. This has caused sinkholes in some areas, and allows for excessive infiltration when water

levels are high.

The work includes pressure testing each joint, and rehabilitating those which do not pass the pressure test. For each joint requiring rehabilitation, grout is pressure-injected and allowed to cure, thus sealing the joint from within the pipe (please refer to Figure No. 1).

This project is divided into two phases, over two budget years. This first phase is 12,000 LF, the next phase is 10,000 LF. Flow monitoring will be performed pre-project and post-project in order to determine the viability of this method of joint rehabilitation.

The contract was advertised and two bids were received on October 1, 2015. The contract was therefore re-advertised and two bids were received on October 8, 2015 as follows:

The apparent low bidder is Lake County Sewer Co., Inc. with a bid amount of \$503,599.00. Lake County Sewer has not completed any previous projects for MSD. Staff therefore checked references for Lake County's work on previous projects of similar scope. The references all had positive comments regarding this company.

Please refer to the attached documentation for further details.

FISCAL IMPACT: The FY15-16 Construction Budget for this project is \$567,000.00.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends award of this contract to Lake County Sewer Company, Inc. in the amount of \$503,599.00, subject to review and approval by District Counsel.

This is the "Packer". The joint is isolated and sealed-off within its working limits, pressure tested, and grout is injected as required to seal the joint.

A chemical grout barrier outside manholes stops leaks, but it also protects interior linings from hydrostatic pressure.

Mainline packers are used to stop infiltration and extiltration through pipe joints and circular cracks.

The South French Broad Interceptor Grouting project is located within the Biltmore Estate in Asheville. A 36-inch sewer interceptor runs through the Estate, adjacent to the French Broad River for approximately 22,000 linear feet. The interceptor conveys an average daily flow of 4.1 MGD of wastewater from South Asheville to MSD's Carrier Bridge Pump Station.

The interceptor is believed to be a major source of Inflow & Infiltration (I&I) into MSD's collection system. Leaking pipe joints (confirmed via CCTV), and the development of sinkholes over the line provide evidence of joint failure.

Two methods of pipe rehabilitation were evaluated prior to this project: cured-in-place-pipe (CIPP) lining and chemical grouting. CIPP lining rehabilitates the entire pipe and is the most costly option, while chemical grouting targets pipe joints only. After determining that the interceptor is in good structural condition, but that the joints are the source of I&I, grouting was selected as the preferred method of rehabilitation.

Chemical grouting is a well-established method of pipe rehabilitation; however, this will be the first grouting project completed by the District to date. In order to accommodate other projects within the CIP, only 12,000 LF of the 22,000 LF interceptor line will be rehabilitated this fiscal year. In addition, staff will validate this rehabilitation process and confirm its effectiveness. If successful, the remaining 10,000 LF will be completed in FY '16-'17.

After receiving only two bids on October 1, 2015, the project was re-advertised per NC General Statutes. On October 8, 2015, two sealed bids were received at 2:00 pm. Results were as follows:

The apparent low bidder is Lake County Sewer Company, Inc. with a bid amount of \$503,599.00. The FY15/16 construction budget for this project is \$567,000.00. Since Lake County Sewer Company, Inc. has not performed work for the District in the past, references were checked to confirm quality of work, timeliness of completion, and work performed within budget. References were contacted by telephone in order to discuss Lake County's work; three responded and provided positive feedback.

Staff recommends award of this contract to Lake County Sewer Company, Inc. contingent upon review and approval by District Counsel.

Mr. Delk stated that Lake County Sewer Co. has performed work for the City of Greenville for over 10 years and has an excellent reputation. The City of Greenville contracts with Lake County Sewer on an annual basis to perform chemical grouting of sanitary sewer lines ranging in size from 6"-15". Much of the city's sewer infrastructure is 80+ year old clay pipe with 3-5' joints. Chemical grouting over the past 5 years has reduced flow into Greenville's WWTP by millions of gallons per day according to Mr. Delk. The City of Greenville does not have full-time inspection on grouting projects, so they rely on testing logs and CCTV provided by Lake County Sewer Co. to confirm project completeness. Mr. Delk said that Lake County is very organized and that they have never had a problem obtaining requested testing and grouting data.

The City of Strongville has just completed its third grouting contract with Lake County Sewer Co. Ms. Daley stated that the contractor has performed well on each job and that she has been pleased with their work. Strongville does not have full-time inspection services, so she requested that all pressure testing data and CCTV work be handed over for review. She stated that Lake County Sewer Co.'s record keeping is meticulous. The most recent contract with Lake County Sewer was approximately \$452,000 for grouting 25,000 LF of 8" VCP. The two prior contracts were both in excess of 10,000 LF and \$300k. Strongville is in the process of collecting post-grouting flow data to confirm effectiveness of these projects.

Mackay Engineering has designed, bid, and managed many sanitary sewer grouting projects for the City of Fairview Park, four of which have been completed by Lake County Sewer Co. Fairview Park has an established grouting program, created in the early 1990s. Much of Fairview Park's collection system is 90-100 year old clay pipe. The projects completed by Lake County Sewer Co. included grouting mainline joints in pipes ranging from 8-18" in diameter, and grouting of 4" services laterals. Each project completed for the City of Fairview Park has been approximately 5,000-8,000 LF in length. Ms. Kerber stated that Lake County Sewer Co. has always performed well and she highly recommends them for grouting work. She expressed that Lake County gets the job completed quickly, and that the work is done correctly. Mackay Engineering has required Lake County Sewer Co. to retest line segments 2 years after initial application, and that they have never had to regrout pipe joints. Ms. Kerber's experience with grouting suggests that lines need to be regrouted every 10-15 years.
